ENTRY FEES: \$2.00 for Single Birds
 \$3.00 for Trio Lots (Chickens Only)

ENTRY DEADLINE: Entries must be postmarked no later than Wednesday, August 3rd. Send your entry form with fees to POULTRY DEPT., CLACKAMAS COUNTY FAIR, 694 NE 4th Ave, Canby, OR 97013. Fees must accompany entries.

COOP IN TIME: Birds may be brought to the Fair on Monday, August 15, 2011 from 8:00am to 9:00pm.

RELEASE TIME: Birds will be released from 8:00pm to 10:00pm Sunday, the last day of the Fair. No vehicles will be admitted while fair patrons are present.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

To ensure successful competition exhibitors must comply with these rules and the general rules and the regulations of the Clackamas County Fair.

In filling out your entry you must state plainly your name, address, phone number, exhibitor number (see entry form) and the breed, color, leg band number, lot and price if for sale, of each bird entered.

1. Competition is open to anyone. 4-H and FFA exhibitors may show in Open Class as long as they show different birds than they are showing in 4-H and FFA.
2. Every bird must be entered in one of the following CLASSES:
Class 1 LARGE CHICKENS
Class 2 BANTAM CHICKENS
Class 3 DUCKS
Class 4 GEESE
Class 5 TURKEYS
Class 6 GUINEAS
3. Every bird must be entered in one of the following LOTS:
Lot 1 – C (COCK): Male at least one year old.
Lot 2 – H (HEN): Female at least one year old.
Lot 3 – K (COCKEREL): Male 4 months to one year old
Lot 4 – P (PULLET): Female 4 months to one year old.
Lot 5 – OT (OLD TRIO): (For Chickens only), 1 cock and 2 hens of same breed and variety.
Lot 6 – YT (YOUNG TRIO): (For Chickens only), 1 cockerel and 2 pullets of the same breed and variety.
4. All birds exhibited must have a numbered leg band. The superintendent will have a few leg bands available during coop-in time for a small fee.
5. During the period of the fair, the fair will feed and water the birds.
6. This show is sanctioned by the American Poultry Association and the American Bantam Association and their show rules will apply.
7. Premiums will be paid only on breeds and varieties recognized by the American Poultry Association or the American Bantam Association. All other birds will be awarded ribbons only, at the discretion of the judge.
8. Birds showing evidence of disease will not be accepted and entry fees will be forfeited.
9. The superintendent or any assigned judge shall have full authority to disbar from competition any entry which is too immature, diseased or otherwise unworthy of the breed it represents.
10. There will be no advertising, premiums or anything else placed on the coops or in the building without the approval of the superintendent.
11. Sale birds will only be released at coop-out time.
12. Birds will be tested for Pullorum after judging, unless NPIP or other testing papers are submitted.

Large Chicken Classes: American, Asiatic, English, Mediterranean, Continental, and All Other Standard Breeds.

Bantam Classes: Modern Game, Old English Game, Single Comb Clean Legged, Rose Comb Clean Legged, All Other Combs Clean Legged, Feather Legged.

Ducks Classes: Heavy Ducks, Medium Ducks, Light Ducks, Bantam Ducks

Geese Classes: Heavy Geese, Medium Geese, and Light Geese.

Turkeys: all compete in one class.

Guineas: all compete in one class.

GRAND CHAMPIONS

A Rosette will be awarded to the Grand and Reserve Champions in Large Chickens, Bantam Chickens and Waterfowl.

AMERICAN POULTRY ASSOCIATION CLUB MEET

The APA invites you to become a member. Annual dues are \$15.00 for one (1) year, \$40.00 for three (3) years, \$25.00 for one (1) year outside the U.S. and Canada. Junior dues (for those 18 and under) are \$10.00 per year. Endowment Trust Life Membership is \$240. All Annual and Endowment Trust Life Members receive our yearbook and are eligible to earn points toward a Master Exhibitor Award. Every member is eligible for the awards at this show. An application for membership must be made at the show or sent to the American Poultry Association prior to the judging to be eligible for APA Awards.

A minimum of five (5) Master Exhibitor points will be awarded to any qualified win at this show.

AMERICAN BANTAM ASSOCIATION SPECIAL MEET

Only American Bantam Association, PO Box 127, Augusta, NJ members are eligible for ABA awards. Dues are \$20.00 a year or \$50.00 for three years. Members receive a free copy of the latest available quarterly and the latest available copy of the ABA yearbook, which lists about 900 advertisers and includes a complete breed and variety index. Winners of ABA awards are listed in the yearbook under WHO'S WHO IN BANTAMS. Starred wins are earned by Champions and Reserve Champions in the seven bantam divisions when the number of birds competing is 100 or more. Starred wins are also awarded for Best and Reserve of Breed and Variety when 100 or more are competing.

On special meets a yearly plaque will be awarded listing all the Champions and Reserves of the seven Bantam Divisions when the class is 50 or more competing. The size of the plaque will be determined by the number of wins accumulated during that calendar year.

Certificates will be awarded to Best and Reserve in the seven bantam

divisions where 25-49 birds are competing.

There must be a minimum of 25 birds competing in a bantam division for an award to be given. A single bird may not win more than one starred win in one show.

Bantam Divisions:

1. Modern Game
2. Game - Old English and American game competing
3. Single Comb Clean Leg
4. Rose Comb Clean Leg
5. Feather Leg
6. Any Other Comb Clean Leg
7. Bantam Duck

Plaques will be ordered the end of January for the preceding year. Copy of wins will be sent to winners for confirmation before plaques are ordered.
