ENTRY FEES: \$4.00 per head

Entries in the Swine division must be in the barn by 8:00 p.m., Monday before the fair. Swine can be moved in to the fairgrounds beginning at 4pm on Sunday. Hours for move-in are Sunday, 4pm – 9pm and Monday 9am – 8pm. Release time: no later than 8:00 p.m. Sunday, last day of the fair.

On arrival at Fairgrounds, all hogs must be free of dirt for visual inspection. Hogs will only be unloaded at wash rack area where inspection will take place before hogs may enter barn. All swine will be checked for hog lice and eggs by division superintendent (Open Class, 4-H and FFA) or person designated by the superintendent PRIOR TO UNLOADING ANIMALS.

Any animals found to have lice or eggs will be quarantined to wash rack and will be sprayed or dusted to control such, by owner and owner will take any other measures as directed by the Swine Superintendent.

No swine will be allowed in the show or sale ring that shows signs of lice or eggs.

Any swine exhibitor, who does not cooperate with the Swine Superintendent, Livestock Superintendent, and the attending Fair Veterinarian on the control of hog lice, will be asked to immediately remove their animal(s) from the Fairgrounds. Bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor. **ALL** Swine Pens **MUST** be stripped and cleaned **DAILY**.

Ages of all animals competing for premiums in this department shall be computed from February 1 to August 1. Sows 2 years old or over to be eligible to show must have produced living offspring within 6 months preceding the opening of the fair. Affidavit may be required to substantiate the above. If there are less than two exhibitors in any class, that class will show in class 8, Other Breeds.

All purebred swine must meet breed registration requirements, no papers pending.

SWINE STALL PROMOTION AWARD

To promote more interest in presenting an attractive and educational exhibit, a first place award of \$15 will be given in the Swine Division. Second and third will receive ribbon only. Exhibits will be inspected daily for breed information and showmanship of pens.

Consideration for cleanliness of each exhibitor's area will also be scored. This award presented at the discretion of Department Head depending on participation. Swine breed associations are also eligible for this award.

RULES FOR LITTER OF PIGS AWARD

1. Entry to compete must be submitted to the fair office by **August 1, 2011**. Entries will be placed in a special nursery pen as room allows.
2. Open Class, FFA, or 4-H exhibitor's eligible, but must enter in Open Class and pay the entry fee (Lot 20).
3. Animals entered in this contest can also be entered in the Open, FFA or 4-H classes in which they are eligible.
4. Litter of Pigs must be at least 21 days old on August 16, 2011 and have received all proper immunization shots.
5. Exhibitors with small piglets will be responsible for supplying their own bumper boards so the piglets will remain in their pen. Sow and litter must be provided water as well as heat or fans as conditions require

LITTER OF PIGS SPECIAL AWARDS

A special \$100 award will be given by the **CLACKAMAS COUNTY FAIR BOARD** to the BEST Litter of Pigs shown at the fair.
